

This is open to everyone at the club. We will have a collection point whenever a team is playing at The Welfare Stadium to be able to drop off, collect or swap your boots.



#### CLUB HISTORY

Records exist that a team from Nostell Colliery won a Wakefield District football competition in the 1890s. The club has photographs of Nostell Colliery teams from 1915 & 1921. At that time the football field was not in the present location but on two sites fairly close by.


The Miner's Welfare was formed in 1928 after the purchase of the land by the Miners Trust Fund. The sum of £400 was paid to a local landowner for 4.5 acres which includes the land on which the present ground is situated.

In the late 60's the club had a period of sustained success, winning several Wakefield District competitions and eventually being selected to join the West Yorkshire League, lifting the Division 2 League and Cup double in the 1966/67 season. However, the successful team eventually broke up and the club went back to the Wakefield League in the early 1970's. Enjoying relative success the club began to develop again; two teams were formed, the first team joining the West Yorkshire League in 1982. However sadly even with mining subsidence to the ground, fundraising of over £30,000 allowed the pitch to be levelled off, drainage installed and other ground improvements, Nostell Colliery was closed. The nearby colliery houses (1st to 7th street) were demolished and the Welfare struggled to survive.

The football continued throughout this difficult period. Promotions were seen through the divisions of the West Yorkshire League, which eventually led us to our present NCEL status.

At this point, the club's most successful period in its distinguished history was about to begin, with the appointment of Alan Colquhoun as 1st team Manager in the late 1990's. After initially struggling in the West

Yorkshire Premier League - Alan scored two goals to save us from relegation!





Gary Baker joined as Colquhoun's assistant and the team gradually improved, eventually being crowned Champions of the West Yorkshire Premier League, lifting the corresponding Cup and appearing in 3 consecutive finals, 2 County Cup final appearances and lifting 6 Wakefield & District trophies among other successes.

Off the field, the introduction of the Coalfield Regeneration Trust encouraged other funders to invest in the Miners Welfare. The ground was officially renamed Crofton Community Centre with approximately £1.5 million secured to provide the present facilities with Sport England, Football Foundation and the FA providing substantial sums of money to help the football side of the developments.

With the improvements on and off the field, a successful application to the Northern Counties East League was made, heralding a new and exciting venture for the Club.

Gaining promotion to the NCEL Division 1, Nostell finished a respectable 4th in their first season 2006/7. Due to the Northern Premier League reforming its structure, along with one NCEL going to the wall for financial reasons, Nostell gained promotion to the NCEL Premier Division. A terrific first season in the premier league 2007/8 saw Nostell finish 5th, having led the division for the first quarter.

The following season 2008/2009, successful cup runs in FA Competitions caused an end-of-season fixture congestion. Playing every Saturday, Tuesday and Thursday for the last six weeks of the season, Nostell eventually finished 13th not losing to any of the top four teams home and away. However, the Welfare, who were the underdogs, beat Scarborough Athletic over 2 legs to win the "Presidents Cup", probably the highest point of Nostell's recent history.

During season 2008/9 Nostell had their first player to be signed by a Football League club. Stockport County signed Oli Johnson who impressed during a friendly fixture.



Oli made an instant impact for County who sold him to Norwich City, where he was involved in the League 1 Championship winning team.

Nostell got a percentage of the transfer fee and with appearances mories eventually banked over £20,000.

During the campaign of 2015/16 season, despite a positive start, with several occasion's results failing to match performances, partway through the season Simon and Paul left the club. Despite the hard work and best endeavours of all those involved, players, committee and management it wasn't enough, as a result, the club was relegated from the NCEL Premier League.

A disastrous 2016/17 season in which the club finished bottom of Division 1 we were offered a last-minute reprieve and retained our status in the NCEL.

Halfway through the 2017/18 season, the club was in difficulties once again struggling in Division 1 another managerial change was inevitable. The appointment of joint Managers Simon Houghton & Jason Dodsworth with a huge amount of NCEL experience proved a turning point in the clubs' fortunes, initially securing our NCEL status and avoiding relegation.

The 2018/19 season was overall very positive accumulating the highest number of points in a NCEL season than any previous Nostell side, finishing a creditable fifth and securing a return for the club to The Emirates FA Cup in 2019/20.

Having started the 2019/20 season like a house on fire with six straight league wins in a row, form dipped, players left for pastures new, and the season was heading towards a mid-table finish before COVID-19 struck. The rest is history as we all know.


In guiding the clubs under 19's & 21's over the two previous seasons reaching consecutive cup finals, league champions first time of asking and a hugely creditable second place league finish behind a very strong Harrogate Town u23's,



the committee agreed the way forward was to reward such success and promote from within with the appointment of Ian Walker as First Team manager for the 2020/21 season

Despite many new faces around the club, the emphasis is always to support and develop our youth and junior footballers. Ian's high work ethic, attention to detail and loyalty of his successful group of young rising stars gave them the opportunity to grow and make the step forward to becoming regular first team players. Ian was in charge for three seasons with mid-table respectability achieved on every occasion. Because of work and personal issues Ian resigned after the end of the 2023/24 season. Chairperson over his tenure and the of Houghton and Dodsworth era, Kevin Allsop also stepped down at the same time

The Club advertised extensively to recruit new blood for several key positions and behind the scenes roles. The club received many applicants, eventually after a long stressful process, a team comprising of Liam Willingham, Mathew Wright, Mark Wright, Mark Maspero and Chris Clay were appointed. Other volunteers for important roles are also involved. The Club looked forward to the new 2024/25 season with a new sense of optimism. In September 2024 Liam made the decision to step down as Chairperson. This was a shore tenure in post and as an interim measure Scott, Vice Chairman became Chairperson. In October 2024 the committee appointed Chris Clay as Chairperson for the club due to all his engagement and enthusiasm around the club and his passion to drive the club forward.

The original football club was formed in 1916 as Maltby Main FC (the local colliery). All players were employed at the nearby pit - indeed, a good footballer was often guaranteed employment at the colliery so he could represent the football club! The original Maltby Main FC was disbanded in 1965.

Maltby Miners Welfare FC was formed in 1970 and was the football section of the Miners Welfare. The club played in the Sheffield Senior League until 1972, when they joined the old Yorkshire League and then the Northern Counties East League formed from the merger of the Yorkshire & Midland Leagues. The club began their NCEL life in Division One (South) but the installation of floodlights earned a place in the Premier Division for the 1990/91 season, a very creditable sixth position being attained having won 10 and drawing 2 of the fifteen home games.

Success continued during what was to become the 4 year reign as manager of Colin Walker, the ex-Rotherham United, Sheffield Wednesday, Doncaster Rovers and New Zealand player, who took the club from the Northern Counties East First to the Premier Division where they finished 4th and won the President's Cup in his final season in charge (1992-93). Colin then left to manage Barnsley's Youth team.

In season 1993/94, under the guidance of new player-manager Gary Waller, the Miners briefly headed the table and remained strong championship contenders until the final month of the season when they fell away to finish 7th. Gary resigned because of work commitments just before the start of the 1994/95 season, with his assistant, Richard Moon taking over the helm.

Following the split from the Miners Welfare in mid-1996, the club decided to revert to its former name of Maltby Main FC, although they continue to play on the Welfare ground at Muglet Lane.





After a season of consolidation and 14th place under manager Dave McCarthy, the 1997/98 season saw the Miners top the Premier Division for much of the mid-season period before slipping back to finish in a creditable 6th position. McCarthy was lured away to take over as manager at Unibond League Alfreton Town and former Rotherham United and Maltby player, Steve Fleetwood, was appointed manager in the close season, with Bob Haddrell as his assistant.

After a difficult season, 1999/2000 proved to be one of consolidation and, despite goalscoring problems, the team finished the season strong in defence and midfield only for the NCEL to relegate the club for not being able to fund hardstanding around the pitch for the new season. This scandalous decision was stubbornly adhered to by the league despite the fact that Maltby Miners Welfare, in close season, spent £¼ million on new dressing room and hospitality facilities which were arguably, at the time, the best in the league. If, instead, the relatively paltry sum of £6000 had been spent on hard standing and a new portakabin for hospitality, the club would have remained in the Premier Division with the players having to continue to use damp overcrowded changing facilities - such is the logic of football authorities!

With relegation came the resignation of the management team after only one season in charge and Paul Cavell and Glen Morris took over. Early season form was poor and, with Main rooted to the foot of Division One, with only one league victory, Paul resigned and the board moved swiftly to appoint Russ Eagle as team manager. Despite defeats in his first three matches, Russ managed to turn things around and with only 5 defeats in the last 20 fixtures, Main finished a creditable 9th.

Much hard work was put in the close season to bring Muglet Lane up to standard for the 2001/2002 season. The required hard standing was laid and toilets installed in the new dressing rooms in order that the club retain its league status, but this took a huge financial toll on



the club. With all the previous season's players retained, the club and its supporters were hoping for better things with promotion back to the Premier Division but, after a poor start, Russ Eagle left the club and Wilf Race and Vinnie Brady were put in charge of team affairs. Wilf had left Parkgate a month before Eagle's departure from Muglet Lane, but several players followed him to Maltby and a spectacular run of form saw The Miners rise, in three months, from next to bottom to head the Division One table. The poor start to the season, however, eventually told and, following an indifferent run in, the club finished in 6th position.

2002/03 season started badly and Chairman, Gary Kitching took over team affairs on a temporary basis but was very successful - two wins and a draw in his three matches at the helm before the former Rotherham United, Doncaster Rovers and Altrincham midfielder, Shaun Goodwin was chosen as new manager from a host of applicants with Bryn Webster as his assistant. League results were disappointing but the club did reach the semi-final of the Sheffield Senior Cup, narrowly losing 2-1 to Doncaster Rovers at Belle Vue. Hopes were high that 2003-04 would see Main challenging for a return to the Premier Division and these hopes were justified as Shaun and Bryn made subtle changes to the side and made it one to be feared as they clinched the second promotion spot

Results over subsequent seasons were mixed and Wilf Race assumed the role of club Chairman in 2014, after the departure of Mark Ducker, with the stated aim of maintaining our Premier Division status, with a mid-table position the goal. Main found themselves in 7th position in mid September but results declined thereafter and, following the resignation of manager Mick Norbury towards the end of the campaign, finished in 19th place, one spot above but 12 points clear of the relegation zone.

Spencer Fearn and Mark Askwith were appointed joint managers for 2015-16 with former player Andy Tomlinson as 1st Team Coach, John



Stanckfee as goalkeeping coach and Katie Johnson as fitness coach.

Under the new regime, the club's centenary year was a revelation, with Main punching well above their weight, finishing in 7th position, their highest for 15 years, and enjoying a good run in both the FA Cup and Vase.

Spencer Fearn shocked the club by resigning after the season to take up the management of Frickley Athletic and the club moved swiftly to bring back former joint manager, Mark Askwith, along with Scott Mason and John Crossland, who had been very successful in the local Sunday league particularly with The Joker, having won every trophy available including the very prestigious Hallamshire Sunday Cup. The squad confounded everyone with some scintillating performances and results and finished 5th in the Premier Division, the highest since 1992-93.

Mark Askwith resigned his position because of work commitments but Louis Axcell joined the management team from Handsworth Parramore to work alongside Scott Mason and John Crossland for 2018-19. Greater things were expected and turned out that way as we ended it sixth and another cup semi final appearance - but we dipped again. The final was never actually played due to Frickley stating they had no players because the season went beyond April due to the poor weather.

So 19/20 had promise and the manager recruited during summer. But something wasn't the same and the new and older lads started to dip in form. By October we were in the bottom five and lost at home to a bottom three side. That spelt the end for Mason which was a shame, but the right thing to do.

Louis Axcell got the job officially at the end of 19/20 and it was his and John's turn to have a pre-season together. Louis started off with bringing in a new coach Dean Bamforth.



New players followed and we awaited the start date of the 20/21 season as COVID-19 was still to be cleared up fully.

We started the off the 2021/22 season in September with a dramatic FA tie, Corona virus shut us down in all November, we came back in December but when we won 5-2 on Boxing Day that turned out to be our last game. We played ten league games and were 5th when the season was eventually curtailed due to Covid19.

21/22 started well and Main topped the table in late August but had slipped down to mid table by Christmas. Louis left the club in late January and John Stancliffe took the reins on a temporary basis which was made permanent a few weeks later. Main finished 11<sup>th</sup> in the Premier Division but reached the Final of the Sheffield Senior Cup, losing 3-0 to Worksop Town at Doncaster Rovers Eco-Power stadium.

John resigned as manager and Main started the new season with the management team of Andy Dawson and Lee Whitehead who moved to Muglet Lane from Parkgate FC. Several players moved to Main from Parkgate with the new managers and, along with a few who stayed at the club, we were hoping for a period of stability but, despite another appearance in the Senior Cup Final, losing to Emley AFC, Andy and Lee resigned at the end of the season.

Wilf Race moved from Chairman to a commercial role within the club and Kieran Gallagher took on the role of Chairman after a successful period with Kiveton Miners Welfare. Lee Thompson and Jamie Smith took over the managerial reins and recruited yet another new squad, along with a few who stayed for 2023-24. Early season was difficult and Lee resigned after a heavy defeat at Campion and Jamie stepped up to the manager's job. He recruited ex-Sheffield Wednesday legend Miguel Llera as his assistant and hopes were high for a swift climb up the table. Unfortunately things didn't pan out for either the new Chairman and his team and for Jamie on the playing front and all resigned during the Christmas period.



Local businessman and main club sponsor, Kieron White took over as Chairman with Wilf Race returning as Commercial Manager and Dave Watts returning as Vice Chair, Secretary, Treasurer and Media. Andy Dawson and Lee Whitehead returned as team managers as Main looked to put a turbulent few months behind the club and climb to Premier Division safety. However, it was not to be and Andy and Lee resigned again in March after an 8-0 defeat at Garforth Town. Defender Joe Austin and experienced football league defender Joe Skarz took over the reins, at least until the end of the season when Main were relegated on their playing record for the first time in their NCEL tenure.

Joe Austin took the reins for 2024-25 as Main looked to rebuild and bounce back into the Premier Division. New ground improvements were made and new shirt sponsors came on board - the multi-million selling band Bring Me The Horizon whose drummer Matt Nichols is a Maltby lad but Main were only able to finish 10<sup>th</sup> in Divison One.

Joe resigned for personal reasons and James Kaye, the highly successful manager of Scawthorpe Athletic, has taken the helm for 2025-26 with Leon Osborne and Liam Hardy assisting.
